June 24 - Airman by Eoin Colfer. In the late nineteenth century, Conor Broekhart discovers a conspiracy to overthrow the king. He is branded a traitor, imprisoned, and forced to mine for diamonds under brutal conditions while he plans a daring escape from Little Saltee prison by way of a flying machine that he must design, build, and trust to carry him to safety. **Fantasy.**

July 8 - The Big Game of Everything by Chris Lynch. Jock and his eccentric family spend the summer working at Grampus's golf complex, where they end up learning the rules of "The Big Game of Everything."

Contemporary Fiction/Humor.

July 15 - Bones of Faerie by Janni Lee Simner. Fifteen-year-old Liza travels through war-ravaged territory in a struggle to bridge the faerie and human worlds and to bring back her mother while learning of her own powers and that magic can be controlled. **Sci-Fi/Fantasy.**

July 22 - Zen and the Art of Faking It by Jordan Sonneblick. When thirteen-year-old San Lee moves to a new town and school for the umpteenth time, he is looking for a way to stand out when his knowledge of Zen Buddhism, gained in his previous school, provides the answer--and the need to quickly become a convincing Zen master. **Contemporary Fiction/Humor.**

July 29 - The Wave by Todd Strasser. The Wave is based on a true incident that occurred in a high school history class in Palo Alto, California, in 1969. The powerful forces of group pressure that pervaded many historic movements such as Nazism are recreated in the classroom when history teacher Burt Ross introduces a "new" system to his students. **Thriller.**
