- Bell, Cece. El Deafo. (Juvenile Nonfiction 362.42 B413d)

Blabey, Aaron. The Bad Guys in Mission Unpluckable. (Juvenile Fiction Blabey)

Thirteen-year-old Lucy Eberslee, the Gatekeeper's deputy at the end of the world, teams up with Arthur and Rosemary, who are from other worlds, to investigate why the doors between worlds are stuck.

Choldenko, Gennifer. One-Third Nerd. (Juvenile Fiction Choldenko)

Liam lives with his mom and two younger sisters. Dad lives across town, but he's over a lot. And then there's Cupcake, their lovable pup, who guards their basement apartment.
