The Teen Advisory Board is made up of teenage volunteers who desire to be a part of the library's events and services aimed at middle and high school students.

Members of the board attend meetings, assist in designing library events and services for teens, contribute to the growth of the collection, help maintain the teen website, and volunteer their time to work on special projects.

Members of the board are ambassadors for the library. They share information, promote events, encourage friends and peers to utilize library resources, and report feedback and suggestions from their peers and community.

Requirements

- Be in grades 7-12
- Be a L.E. Phillips Memorial Public Library cardholder (Don't have one? Don't worry. They are easy to obtain and free!)
- Complete 5 hours of library community service per year

Expectations

- Be respectful and encourage the ideas of other Teen Advisory Board Members
- Serve as an ambassador for the library by encouraging friends and peers to attend events and use library resources.
- Attend and participate in Teen Advisory Board meetings and library events.
Meetings are held once a month for 60 minutes.

*Board members must attend at least 6 meetings per year and 2 library events a year.

*If you do not attend meetings for 3 months and have not contacted Andria or the library you will no longer be considered a Teen Advisory Board member.

*If life gets in the way and you are unable to fully participate as a Teen Advisory Board member, let us know. We will do what we can to accommodate your situation and keep you involved if desired.
