There was no report from the committee on rules.

The librarian, Miss Biscoe, reported that she had met Mr. Miller, of Patton & Miller, Chicago, Illinois. at Madison, on December , and that after going over the plans of the new library building very thoroughly with him he had modified them to meet the wishes of the Board as far as possible and would send the sketches later. In making his plans and estimates the architect included heating apparatus, lighting with fixtures, all wall shelving, delivery desk, toilet room furnished and plumbing, window shades, shelves at end of stacks, decorative glass, architect's and superintendent's fees, and newspapers and periodical cases in walls. His figures would not include news stacks, settees, trucks, sloping book cases nor chairs and other furniture for assembly room. After a thorough discussion of the plans which the architects had first made and had later amended, the Board adjourned to meet on the first Monday evening in January, 1903.
