Book Fan Organizer




What you'll need...

Recycled Book

Paperclips/Adhesive (Maybe)

Pick a book. Either hardcover or paperback will work and depends on your personal preference. If you are using a paperback, feel free to remove the covers and first couple of glued pages in the front and back of the book.



Depending on the number of pages in the book, you will use a different number of pages per fan loop. You can calculate how many fan loops you will have by dividing the total number of pages in the book by the number of pages used for each loop (e.g., a 400 page book will make 20 loops if each loop has 20 pages). Too many pages will prevent the folds from holding without adhesive, so it's recommended to use between 10 and 20 pages. You can use adhesive if necessary, but keep it close to the spine.

If you are doing 20 page loops, count out the first 10 pages and push them to the side. Take the next 10 pages and fold them over toward the outside of the book, tucking them into the crease by the binding. Now, roll the outside 10 pages you already counted back over the new loop and tuck them into the crease on the other side. If done correctly, the pages should hold fairly well. If necessary, you can use paperclips to hold the loops in place until they hold on their own.



Continue overlapping loops until you are near the end of the book. Including or excluding a few pages can help space out pages so you are not left with an odd number at the end. The last pages of the book will need to be folded in the opposite order because the outside pages must be the last to fold into the crease.
